Local Philanthropies Express Support for Affiliation Talks Between Roberson Museum and the Discovery Center

Binghamton, New York (August 31, 2020) -- Roberson Museum and Science Center and the Discovery Center of the Southern Tier began the exciting exploratory talks regarding a potential affiliation in May. These meetings are being facilitated by the New York Council of Nonprofits (NYCON) through their 2020 Southern Tier Capacity Building Program which aims to measurably improve nonprofits' governance operations and business management.
